# **Common Cents Sponsor Responsibilities**

- Complete all Dallas ISD paperwork prior to starting the program. Schools must complete the FASC Activity Funds form and submit documents to campus BOC. Fundraiser form should be submitted by the office manager/financial clerk.
   Approvals must be in place prior to the start date.
- Identify student roundtable to direct fundraising efforts on campus. Lead discussions to assist students with learning what philanthropy means and why philanthropy in our own community is important.
- Assist students in identifying area nonprofit(s) to receive funding. Also encourage students to visit https://www.northtexasgivingday.org/to learn about nonprofits. The selected nonprofit must have a 501 (c) (3) designation.
- Help coordinate fundraisers and oversee money collection. Handle funds with care and keep good records. ALL MONIES MUST BE TURNED IN DAILY. Follow guidelines for handing in money that are detailed in the packet.
- Attend the Common Cents celebraton in the spring with your students. Students
  will be able to present a large ceremonial check to the nonprofits they selected
  and meet representatives from the organizations.

#### Step 1 – Select a Non-Profit Organization

Use the Social Emotional Learning Question Guide as a resource.

Encourage the students to brainstorm problems, challenges and needs in their communities. Identify agencies that address that address these issues.

#### Help Student Develop Criteria for Selection of Nonprofits.

Guide them to identify nonprofits that serve a compelling need in your community, have a positive reputation for helping people and can effectively express their needs and plans for using the money to benefit the community near your school.

Nonprofit organizations selected to receive funds must be registered as a 501(c)(3) to be eligible. To verify that your chosen organization qualifies and is approved search:

# Step 4 – Plan and Execute a Fundraiser

#### **Get the Word Out**

Make sure that EVERYONE knows your campus is participating. Inform all teachers about the program and encourage them to get their classes involved. Make posters, include in your morning announcements, put in your school newsletter, send home the enclosed parent letter.

**The Collection phase will begin October 2.** Collected monies must always be under the direct supervision of school personnel, and at no time should it be left unattended.

#### Remember to track funds raised - funds MUST be collected and deposited daily.

\*STUDENTS CAN ONLY COUNT money under your supervision. Let them organize the money so the Office Manager can easily make the daily deposit. Funds must be turned in by the sponsor with the appropriate completed Teacher/Sponsor Deposit Slip.

# **Step 5 - Empower Students, Impact your Community, Have Fun and Celebrate**

Each school is invited to attend the Common Cents Ceremonial Check Presentation to be held in Spring 2024 where students get a chance to meet representatives from their chosen nonprofit.

#### **Properly Handling the Money**

#### **Counting and Turning in Money**

Students can learn about money responsibility by doing the preliminary money counting. With your supervision let them complete the Itemized Receipt Form provided in this kit. Coach your students to organize the money to make the Office Manager's job easy.

As Campus Sponsor you will need to take money to campus financial clerk/activity fund/office manager daily. Please make note of each date and amount of each deposit. <u>All checks should</u> <u>be made out to Dallas ISD with Common Cents in the memo line</u>.

#### Instructions for Office Manager or Activity Fund Manager

- All monies must be <u>DEPOSITED DAILY</u> to book and receipted in campus (461) Common Cents Account "CO" with notes "Common Cents collections".
- ALL Common Cents funds (no matter the group handling) must be deposited into the 461-CO account for tracking purposes.
- Office Manager or Activity Fund Manager will need to provide the total deposited to Tonya Mayberry Davis (tmayberry@dallasisd.org) by December 15, 2023.
- Based on this information, Common Cents will invoice the Dallas ISD for total amount collected. Partnership and Volunteer Services will work with Accounting to make sure monies are processed correctly to ensure monies are properly transferred to CFT for distribution to non-profits.

#### Social and Emotional Learning SEL Reflection Questions

As your campus participates in the Common Cents initiative, students and staff members have a valuable opportunity to develop social and emotional learning (SEL) skills such as empathy, self-awareness, reflection, and community building.

Here are suggested guiding questions for campus-wide / classroom reflection for secondary grade levels:

- How would you like to help our community/world become a better place? What does that look and feel like?
- Based on the non-profit organization and community cause that your campus has chosen for fundraising, how do you connect with that cause?
  - What do you already know about the cause? What questions do you still have?
- What are your core values? Think about 3-5 values that are most important to you and connect with your beliefs and aspirations.
  - If possible, share your core values with a partner. Do you have any values in common?
  - Are there any causes or organizations that connect with one or more of the values that are important to you?
- Everyone is a leader with unique skills and perspectives. How would you describe yourself as a leader? What leadership skills do you have?
- What does philanthropy mean?
  - General definition: philanthropy is giving your time, personal strengths / skills, and / or goods / money to address a local, national, or global cause
  - Why is it important to help others?
  - When has someone helped you? What happened? How did you feel?
  - Why is it important for leaders to give and/or help others?
- What does it mean to have empathy for others?
  - How does it feel when someone listens and understands your feelings?
  - Why does showing empathy for others matter?
- What are you grateful for [today, this week, this semester, etc.]?
- How does the Common Cents cause connect with your community?
  - What impact do you hope the fundraiser will have within your community?
- What other issues or challenges do you see in your community that you feel compelled to address?
  - Why is that issue (or multiple issues) important to you?
- In addition to fundraising, what are other ways to serve your community?
- How can you continue being a leader in your community after the Common Cents initiative wraps up?

Dear Parents of Student Leaders, We wanted to share with you that our school has chosen to participate in the Dallas ISD Common Cents program and your child has been selected to be a student leader for our school.

Common Cents is a student-driven educational program offered exclusively to Dallas ISD to teach philanthropy by enabling students to play an active role in raising money for their communities.
